CRTOS Business Meeting Minutes

April 24, 2012

President Jack Powers called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Current board members present: Max Brown, Mike Bryant, Ron Deamer, Rob Kingdom, Gary Nelson, Jack Powers, Paul Tichy. Directors-elect present: Stuart Hall, Bo Vernier. Current board members absent: Richard Lawson. Directors-elect absent: Bob Hinson, Jonas Nordwall, Lou Paff.

A quorum was declared.

Minutes of the March board meeting were approved as distributed.

Max Brown asked about the minutes of the membership meeting. The membership, not the board, approves those minutes. They will be published in the *Clarion* prior to the next membership meeting, and approved at the meeting.

Ron Deamer presented the treasurer's report. One CD is maturing. Ron requested guidance from the board on what to do. The board's direction was to roll it over.

OLD BUSINESS

The International Youth Silent Film Festival event will be held at the Hollywood Theatre May 22, 23, and 24; Nathan Avakian will again be the organist. One evening will be designated "CRTOS Night."

Paul Tichy moved to authorize up to \$300 for printing to help promote the IYSFF. Motion Carried.

The board discussed the state of the operating agreement with the Hollywood and the concerns of some that progress appeared stalled once again. Mike Bryant, speaking as crew chief on the organ project, pointed out that while work on chest restoration is progressing, and we are moving some completed components into the Main side chamber,

he is reluctant to begin any actual installation in the absence of both an operating agreement and some movement on the part of the theatre to address the leaks that pass through that chamber. Discussion centered on how we can position ourselves as supportive partners with the Hollywood and encourage progress.

Gary Nelson, who has donated a significant amount of the money in the organ fund, offered to exempt some portion of that money from the restriction that it be used specifically for the organ, to allow it to be designated to the Hollywood for repairs to the chamber, to include addressing the leak issue. The board thanked Gary for his action, and will begin work on a specific proposal to the Hollywood.

President Jack Powers provided a brief status update and recap of the past year's activities for the benefit of the directors-elect.

There being no more old business, the outgoing directors were thanked for their service and invited to remain as guests for the remainder of the meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

The new directors were seated. Jack Powers, acting as presiding officer, opened the floor for nominations for the four officer positions. Jack was re-nominated as President, and Max Brown was nominated as Secretary. Both positions were approved by acclamation.

Due to the absence of three of the new directors, the selection of Vice President and Treasurer was deferred to the May meeting. Rob Kingdom was appointed to form and chair a Marketing Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:05pm.
